CADY'S CORNER

Hello Tri-Par Residents,

2024 has been a rough year so far for Tri-Par. First, we had the record rainstorm in June that brought over 17 inches of rain in a short period of time, and many homes were flooded. Then came Tropical Storm Debby which dumped large amounts of rain causing sustained damage and more flooding. Hurricane Helene passed to our west giving us high winds but little damage. Two weeks later, Hurricane Milton came right over us as a Category 3 storm. It's been reported that Milton was the first storm in 103 years to hit the Bay area. At least 70% of the Park received some damage and 35-40% of that could be a total loss. We had no power or internet and some had no water.

Within two days, the residents started to get organized to help each other. Then different groups started to show up to offer food, water, and tarps. The Tri-Par family started making hot meals in the Clubhouse for anyone in the Park. By Saturday, over 30 contractors and trucks for FPL showed up and started repairing the power lines. By Sunday, over 50% of the park had power. As of this writing, (October 15th) approximately 85% of the power has been restored to the Park.

We want to thank all of the groups that provided supplies, food and support during this extremely difficult time including Grace Community Church in Lakewood Ranch (Convoy of Hope), Toni Yeomans with Assisting Hands Home Care (FEMA form assistance) and countless others that make Tri-Par the wonderful place it is.

Stay Safe, See you around the Park.

POLICIES & PROCEDURES UPDATES



At the September 17 Board Meeting, the following updates were made to our Policies and Procedures:

Item 5.01 (H) – Day Guests – Someone who may accompany a Tri-Par Resident to a specified function and only for a limited number of hours on any given day. These visitors are not required to have background checks nor are they authorized to purchase a FOB. Resident will remain with the Day Guest at the specified function at all times.

Item 5.05 (10) – Pool/Spa/Deck/Patio – Tri-Par Estates Park and Recreation provides music on the pool/spa/deck/patio area for residents listening enjoyment, Monday through Saturday, between the hours of 11:30-4:00. Exceptions are made for Club activities that have live entertainment scheduled on the pool deck (i.e., Fun & Sports patio parties, etc.) No other music is allowed to be played during these hours or at live events by residents/guests without the use of earbuds.

Item 5.12 (E3) – Informal Unscheduled Groups – Rooms are monitored by camera/surveillance equipment. Any person causing damage or using furnishings/equipment inappropriately will be liable for all damage/repair/replacement cost. Any person may be banned from further use of the facilities.

Item 5.16 (A5) - Bulletin Boards - Deleted.

Item 5.16 (C2) – Guidelines – Posters shall not exceed 8½ x 11 inches. Items for sale or rent will be typed on 4 x 6 cards, date-stamped by office and removed after 30-days of posting except if extended by the lister.

Item 5.19 (1, 3, 4, 6, 7, 8) Miniature Golf

- The Miniature Golf course is for use of all residents and guests. Guests must be accompanied by the resident and have FOB/ Combo lock access to the equipment.
- 3. Children under age 12 may not play unless supervised by a resident or parent.

- Putters and balls are available in the shed by the course. Equipment must be returned to the building when finished. Access to equipment is available via FOB/Combo lock.
- 6. The course has been renovated by volunteers and staff of Tri-Par Estates. All players should help keep the course clean.
- 7. The course may be used from 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. daily.
- 8. This area is monitored by camera and surveillance equipment. Any person causing damage to miniature golf course or using equipment inappropriately will be liable for all damages and cost for repairs/replacement. Any person may be banned from further use of the course.

Item 5.41 – Political signs shall be removed within 21 days after the election.

TRI-PAR COVENANT CHURCH POTLUCK DINNER



HORSESHOES

Throwing a horseshoe has been around for a long time. At the beginning of the 20th Century, there was a general agreement about how horseshoes should be played; however, details

differed. Organizers of matches published their own rules in the local newspaper. The most dramatic difference from the modern game was the center pin may have only been two inches from the ground. In 1920, the center pin grew to eight inches. By 1925, the pin was 10 inches high and the opposing pins were 40 feet apart.

A horseshoe pit was built at the White House by President Harry Truman, and the pit was recreated for President George H. Bush.

Here at Tri-Par, the horseshoe pins are regulation size and built for many persons to play. Come on out and try your hand at throwing the horseshoe. Men will begin their winter season on Thursday, November 7. Spectators and cheerleaders are welcome. Women will begin play on Tuesday, December 3. 'Tis time for outside fun!

Thanksgiving Corn

There are only two surviving documents that reflect the original Thanksgiving meal which included deer, wild fowl, cod, bass and flint, a native variety of corn.

Ingredients:

- 8-12 bacon slices, chopped
- 4 cups corn kernels (fresh or can, drained)
- 1/2 cup red bell pepper, chopped
- 1/2-1 package cream cheese, cubed
- 1/2 cup half and half
- 1 tsp. sugar
- 2 Tbs. flour
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. pepper
- 1/4 tsp. paprika
- 1/2 tsp. chili powder

Directions:

- 1. Cook bacon in a large skillet until crisp; remove bacon and drain reserving 2 Tbs. drippings in skillet. Set bacon aside.
- 2. Sauté corn, onion and peppers in hot drippings until tender.
- 3. Add cream cheese and half & half until cheese melts. Stir in ½ of the bacon, sugar, flour, salt & pepper, paprika, chili powder.
- 4. Bake at 375° for 15 minutes. Top with remaining bacon and serve.

- 1/3 cup water

KNOW THE RULES

State Laws

Florida Golf Cart Laws

Effective October 1, 2023, Chapter 2023-67, L.O.F. (CS/CS/HB 949) required that a person operating a golf cart on a public road or street, as authorized by the responsible local government entity, must:

- If 18 years of age or older, possess a form of government-issued photographic identification; or
- If under 18 years of age, possess a valid learner's driver license or valid driver's license.

Sarasota County

Contracting/Licensed Contractors

Any new structure or improvements to an existing structure must be performed by a State of Florida or locally-registered Sarasota County contractor. Owner-builders can perform work with the applicable permit. To report suspected unlicensed contracting or activity, please call 941-861-5000 or Crime Stoppers at 941-366-TIPS (8477); you may remain anonymous.

ALERT Sarasota County --- REPLACES Code Red Warning System

Sarasota County has switched from Code RED to a new alert system for emergency alerts for items such as water main breaks, weather warnings, etc.

Sarasota County Code Highlights

- **Junk, Trash and Debris**: Prohibited from being left in the yard and must be disposed of properly. This includes, but is not limited to wood, tires, automobile parts, hazardous waste, abandoned property, unusable or discarded household items, inoperative or discarded machinery or equipment, motor vehicles and trailers, which are inoperative or lack current license tags, solid waste, construction or demolition materials.
- *Unlicensed, Inoperative Vehicles*: All vehicles must be operable and have current license tags or must be stored in a completely enclosed building.
- **Overweight Vehicles**: Parking, servicing repair and storage of trucks, buses, vans, and tractor trailers in excess of 6,000 pounds vehicle empty weight is prohibited in residential or open use districts.
- Living in Motor Homes or RVs in Residential Areas: It shall not be used for living, sleeping, housekeeping or business purposes and shall not be hooked to any utilities.
- **Building Permits**: Before the start of any construction or structural repair, check with the County permitting Office (861-6678) to ensure if a permit is required.

- Household Garbage and Yard Waste: All waste must be in trash cans, plastic bags or tied bundles, weighing no more than 40 pounds. Put containers out no sooner than 5 pm on the day before pickup (Sunday) and remove them by 10 am the day after (Tuesday). All containers are to be stored inside or rear yards only. You must separate yard waste from solid waste.
- **Household Hazardous Waste**: Except for motor oil and filters, hazardous waste is not collected at the curb. You must bring these types of items to a collection center, neighborhood collection or community collection program for proper disposal.
- *Appliances*: Residents may call the Tri-Par Scrap Pickers (Flea Market) to schedule a pick-up for an appliance or scrap metal. Please call Brad at 617-548-3343 for pick up.

Call the Sarasota Call Center (all violations) at 941-861-5000 or Code Enforcement at 941-861-6403 to report a violation of these codes.

Recycling

We are all aware of the need to cut down on our trash and the impact it has on our environment. Some activities you can undertake to reduce the impact of the waste you produce:

Waste Prevention: Avoid buying more than you need. Print only documents and emails that must be legally stored in paper form.

Waste Reduction: Avoid products with excessive packaging. Buy loose vegetables instead of pre-packed goods.

Reuse: Repurpose plastic bags. Find creative ways to transform used containers into home storage bins.

Recycle: We are all recycling in our homes, but sometimes find we are attending or running meetings or social events where the building does not have recycling facilities. (Such as our Tri-Par Clubhouse) Club leaders can arrange to have cardboard items, pop cans and steel cans taken home so that these articles can be recycled

Dogs and Cats

Sarasota County Ordinance Chapter 14 contains the regulations concerning pets and other animals. These regulations contribute to the well-being of the pets in our community and, therefore, to the well-being of us all.

- Each year you must obtain a license certificate and tag for your dog or cat. In order to receive the license, your
 pet must be vaccinated against rabies by a licensed veterinarian. The official county license may be attached
 to a collar or harness and must be worn by a dog or cat at all times.
- Your dog or cat may not run at large on any public property or the property of another and must be under the
 direct control of a responsible person. Direct control always means immediate and continuous physical control
 of an animal (dog or cat) by means of a fence, leash, cord or chain of sufficient strength to restrain the animal.
- Under no circumstances shall a person improperly tether any animal. It is unlawful to tether an animal
 outdoors, except when all 10 conditions (listed in Sarasota County Code of Ordinances, Section 14-35) are met.
 The most important condition is, "The Animal is in visual range of the Owner, and the Owner is located outside
 with the Animal."
- There have been instances when individuals are frightened by the behavior of our animals. If this occurs to you or you observe anything listed above, please report the incident to Animal Services at 941-861-9500.

F.I.S.H. Transportation (Free Medical Transportation)

Free medical transportation (via automobile) for Sarasota residents only. Donations are accepted. Rides available in the Sarasota area only. Transportation is for medical appointments only. MUST call to schedule 48 hours ahead and appointments must be between 9 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. Phone: 941-953-5838

Tri-Par Policies and Procedures

Background Check for New Owners, Renters, or Caregivers and Guests Who Stay More Than 30 Days

Background checks are required for all first-time buyers, renters, or caregivers in Tri-Par Estates. A background check is also required for first-time guests staying more than 30 days. Renters, caregivers, and guests who have left the Park for 12 months or more must reapply for a background check. A per person application form and per person \$50.00 fee must be submitted to the Tri-Par Office a minimum of 30 days prior to the desired occupancy date for processing and the Board's action. The new application form is available in the Office.

Board Approval is Required Before Moving into Tri-Par Estates

If a renter, buyer, or caregiver moves in without the Board's prior approval, the first action will be to start the process to assess a fine against the owner in accordance with Section 22 of our deed restrictions. Secondly, unapproved renters or owners will be required to vacate the property and leave the park. If they refuse and it becomes necessary for legal action to remove the unapproved occupant(s), the Board of Trustees shall be entitled to recover all costs, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees (Section 21 of Deed Restrictions) from the property owner.

Use of Tri-Par Pool and Spa

Adult supervision is required for children under 12 years of age when at all areas of the Pool. No one under 12 is permitted in the Spa. Pool and Spa rules are posted at the pool area.

Speed Limit in Tri-Par

The speed limit throughout our Park is 20 MPH. We have many walkers, bikers, and people on their golf carts every day. For the safety of all our residents, please do your part in observing the speed limit. If you have guests, let them know we would very much appreciate their maintaining the 20 MPH speed limit within the Park.
